



CONSIDER THE CONSEQUENCES OF VAPING



A Canadian teen developed a dangerous vaping illness that doesn't look like lung illnesses seen in patients across the U.S. Instead, it resembles the kind of lung damage workers at a microwave popcorn factory developed years ago from breathing in a buttery flavoring.

Teen vapers up to 7 times more likely to get COVID-19 than non-e-cig users, says new Stanford study

“Being a 21-year-old, I should not be spending six days in the hospital for lung complications,” said one young vaper who survived coronavirus.

Vaping can harm your lungs relatively quickly, increasing the risk of conditions like asthma and bronchitis.

Vaping - Consequences at RVS

Tobacco and Vaping Products Act (amended, November 19, 2018)

- selling to or possession of vaping products by persons under the age of 18 is prohibited.

If a student has a vape at school, it will be confiscated. A call home will be made with an option to have it disposed of by the school or picked up by parents.

Refusal to hand over a vape could result in a 5 day suspension.

If a student is vaping on school property, they may be suspended for a day.

If a student is vaping within the school building, they may be suspended for 2 days.

Repeated offences = increased consequences; the RCMP could also become involved.

This is in alignment with consequences at many CESD schools, including Sundre

DRESS CODE EXPECTATIONS - all Genders

You need to be dressed appropriately for school.

Clothing worn to school should be appropriate for an educational setting.

School administration reserves the right to make the final decision on what is or is not acceptable.

Behaviour Expectations

Respectful interactions:

- be mindful of your space; pushing and shoving, even in fun, can and most often does lead to problems
- a fight will lead to suspensions for all involved
- if you are encouraging or arranging a fight to occur you may also face a suspension
- If you have a problem with another student, find a staff member to help you; if they give you an instruction to stop or change your behaviour, you are to follow it
- expectation is for best behaviours for guest teachers

Behaviour Expectations

Respectful Language

- children as young as 3 years old are attending our school and walking the hallways
- it is important to be understanding and respect other people's points of view
- there is to be no foul, vulgar or insulting language

Remember:

Once it is said out loud, staff needs to address it.

Behaviour Expectations

Respect for property:

- we are fortunate to have the building and playground we do to work, learn and play in
- treat furniture, equipment and the building itself with respect and ensure you leave it in the same or better condition than you received it
- that includes times outside of school hours (wrapping the swings; jumping on benches until they break; climbing on the roof; etc)
- failure to comply may result in a detention, suspension or no trespassing order
