On our Support Staff Matters committee, Ms. Logan meets with other professionals to discuss ways to better support students. The Parents Matters committee was re-established by Division Office a few years ago and at recent meetings a School Council member has attended as Sundre representatives in order to provide a parent perspective. A big thanks to these parents for working with this committee!




